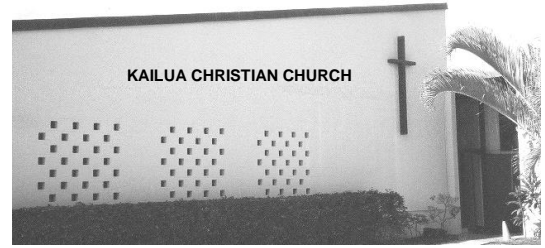

“For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.”

(I Corinthians 1: 18)

I find it a little ironic that the very first day of April, which we all know as April Fool's Day is also Palm Sunday, the first day of the holiest week of the church year, appropriately named Holy Week. Prior to this day of fools, I find myself going back and forth between sacred contemplation about the meaning and importance of Holy Week and what harmless, funny prank I might pull on you, the ohana of Kailua Christian Church. Do I really want to make jokes on the day that begins the final chapter in the life of Jesus Christ? What an interesting dilemma as the silly secular collides with the deeply devotional. Is there a place for both...on this same day? I don't think I will be trying to fool anyone this year. But then again...

There is something to consider here as we contemplate the so called "triumphal entry" of Jesus into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, knowing that with will and determination he is actually approaching his own betrayal, suffering and death on a cross. Comedy Central comedians notwithstanding, nothing clever or funny can be brought to bear on the seriousness and beauty of the selfless act of this peculiar man.

Can you for a moment imagine, now on the night of his betrayal as Judas with a small army approaches, Jesus abruptly ends his passionate prayer by jumping to his feet and shouting out, "April Fool's! April Fool's everybody! I was just joking!

This has all been a joke! Let's go home now and get some rest. Ha, ha, ha, fooled you all."

The joke and the tragedy would then surely be upon us all! We would not know God in the way that Jesus' love and obedience have so fully revealed the Creator and Redeemer. We would not have seen and experienced how the God of life is sovereign even over death, sin, and selfish human ambition and ignorance.

In a way, the events of Holy Week do reveal who the fools are in our midst, and the foolish ways of humankind in general as we continue to try and live life on our own terms instead of the merciful, gracious, and loving terms of God, trusting in the Lord's faithfulness and wisdom day by day. We all stand both convicted and at the same time redeemed: beloved children of an incredibly benevolent God. No joke!

As quick as nations and church have been to proclaim the victory of the cross, there is still tragedy in the forces that created and demanded a cross in the first place; forces which still control our lives more than we like to admit, even sometimes twisting the cross itself into a symbol of aggression and oppression throughout the centuries that followed, and into our present day as well. Be careful how you "use" the cross!

The path that Jesus walked, certainly from Palm Sunday onward, has never been easy, and the call to lose one's own life for Jesus' sake-- for God's sake-- continues to challenge every one of us. And yet, paradoxically, herein lies the hope of life for all the world. If I am to be a fool, may it all be in a life of sacrificial love and obedience

to the God who knows and saves me, as foolish as that may seem to others.

True and trusted Easter blessings upon us and all the world.

NOTES FROM THE MODERATOR

For the last five days, I visited one of the most extravagantly wasteful cities in the United States – Las Vegas! One cannot help but wonder where God might be in this manmade city, where bright lights, thundering water shows, grand hotels, bountiful buffets, money and casinos draw those hoping for a chance at making a million dollars with a spin of a wheel, a toss of dice or a flip of a card.

Extravagance at this level must surely be regarded as the ultimate in self indulgence. Yet, it was thrilling, for five days, to be a part of the color and sounds of such a mesmerizing place. Certainly, most of us, on more than one occasion have been transported to a place so unlike home. And certainly, most of us have been caught up in the thrill of challenging fate and fortune with a spin of a wheel, a toss of dice or a flip of a card.

But, where is God in all of this? Perhaps in the midst of such grandiosity, there is simplicity; and, there was. It was expressed in the hospitality of service workers – waitresses and maids for whom Las Vegas is not a large casino, but a place where there is work to support family. The presence of God became obvious too as we were being driven to the airport by an African driver, who asked me where we came from. He then proceeded to tell my son and me how we are from common beginnings. He said Africans, Pacific Islanders and Asians are very similar and that our dances, songs and the color of our costumes express a spirituality of people close to the earth and to God. I was

sure this man has experienced being discriminated against and he found a connection with the “Hawaiians” in his vehicle. As we got out of the taxi, he offered his hand and said his name was “Indigo”. I returned the handshake, knowing that we are all connected.

While the grandness and color of Las Vegas made for an exciting week, it was good to return home to simplicity...to spirituality...to a closeness to God...to Kailua Christian Church and my church family.

I know the gaudiness of Vegas and the spin of the wheel, the toss of dice, or a flip of a card do not fill my soul...it is the spirituality, it is the connection.

A FEW NOTES FROM THE MUSIC GUY!

It's hard to believe that almost two years ago, Christy and I came to interview for the position of Minister of Music at KCC. I will never forget how nervous we were to come to a church filled with people we didn't know, on an island in the middle of the Pacific Ocean, where we didn't have a clue where we were going to live or what jobs we were going to have. I also remember how quickly those nerves left us after the warm greetings we received from you and felt the love and caring you showed to two complete strangers. From that point on we knew we were making the right decision to come here and we were completely in God's hands.

And now, two years later, we are feeling that nervousness again! Where are you leading us now, God? That is the big question in the Clark house. But there is no question that wherever it is we are going, we have total faith and trust in God to take us where He needs us to go. It tears us apart to leave this wonderful church and island, but at the same time, it is another exciting venture that we will be experiencing with new challenges awaiting us wherever we land. (Wherever we go I hope they have a sense of humor!)

Christy has been busy sending out resumes and has several exciting prospects which have lead her to having to go back earlier than we thought for interviews. As you know, flights cost so much, and for Christy to fly to the mainland for a couple of interviews and then fly back here just to turn around again to fly back for good, just doesn't make sense and frankly, we just can't afford it. Therefore, I'm afraid Christy will be leaving us on April 17. I say us because I will be staying here until the first of September. (Someone has to work for a living.) She has a couple of interviews lined up and hopefully will have more by that time and it just makes more sense to stay in Missouri with her parents until she gets a job and can move to wherever the job is.

The thought of being away from Christy for 5 months is devastating. We've never been away from each other for more than a week and a half. I'm going to need your prayers, big time, and so will she.

During those 5 months, I will be trying to figure out how to ship back our personal items, (mostly Christy and Khloe's clothes!!! If you know of any cheap way, let me know.) We will be shipping back one car, but I will still have to find buyers for our other two cars...so while you're praying. Also during these last 5 months, I hope to help you find a good replacement for the music program here. It shouldn't be hard. All you need to do is find some short person who thinks he (or she) is funny, and have them wave their arms in front of the choir. (It won't matter if they know what they are doing or not because the choir has learned to never pay any attention to me at all!) The only difference will be...you'll never find anyone who loves them as much as I do.

Until I leave, I hope to get as many hugs and kisses as I can and enjoy the time we have together. We will never say goodbye because we will always be back during the summer months. This will always be our home away from home and you will always be our church family and always be in our hearts. We love you all.

It was an awesome time of being refreshed, inspired, and renewed.

We celebrate Easter because it is a time of hope and renewal of our spirits... we welcome each and every one of you to join us for one, or all, of the following special events that have been planned for Holy week:

**April 01, 10 am, Palm Sunday...** The final week of the season of Lent, and therefore the final week of Jesus' life, which we call Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday, April 1 this year (No fooling!). Join us for this special service which begins with the children waving palm branches and processing in to the sanctuary. The sermon for this day will be a special reading of the Passion story from Mark's gospel in which the congregation participates, followed by communion.

#### **April 05, Maundy Thursday**

On Maundy Thursday April 5 ("New Commandment Thursday"), please join in our annual soup and roll dinner in the sanctuary at 6:15 pm. This is followed by a worship service beginning at 7:00 p.m. when we observe Jesus' Last Supper followed by a service of Tenebrae ("shadows") when 13 candles are lit and then extinguished one by one as we remember Jesus' final hours. Following worship we return home in darkness, silence and contemplation.

**April 06, Good Friday.** Join us at St. Christopher's Episcopal Church, 93 North Kainalu Drive at 12:00 noon for a Windward Coalition of Churches service in which we will carry a cross through the neighborhood, stopping periodically to read and reflect on scripture. Those who have difficulty walking may enter the sanctuary for guided reflection with peaceful music. When the walking folks return, we will conclude worship together with song and prayer.

#### **April 08, Easter Sunday – He Is Risen!**

Oh what a joyous and wonderful morning in the life of the world! Sunrise is 6:18 a.m., so we are going to meet at the road leading to the Makapu'u Lighthouse trail at **5:30 a.m.** for our annual pilgrimage to the "tomb" where we will celebrate together the rising of the Son (sun?) with a couple of songs and prayer. This continues to be a truly inspirational and moving experience, so please consider joining us! The path we walk is entirely paved, but it is an upward hike of 30+ minutes. Bring a small bottle of water. It is very dark and cool when we begin, so you may want a flashlight and jacket. As you warm up and light enters the morning sky you'll still need to carry what you bring, though, so pack light.

**Easter Breakfast** – All are welcome to yummy table fellowship as we enjoy an Easter breakfast at the church beginning at 8:00 a.m. and concludes at 9:30 a.m.

**Worship** begins at 10:00 a.m. with the floor cross of scorched wood transformed into a blossoming flower cross of color, life, and celebration!

**Egg Hunt for the Children** following worship as we fellowship around the table again during refreshment time.

These are wonderful opportunities to experience our Easter story in all of the despair of desertion, selflessness of sacrifice, and the victory of life, which is God's legacy to us in Jesus Christ the Son. Help make this time in the life of Christ's church truly special by joining one another often in worship.

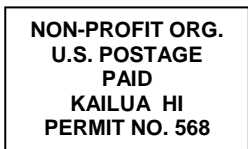
