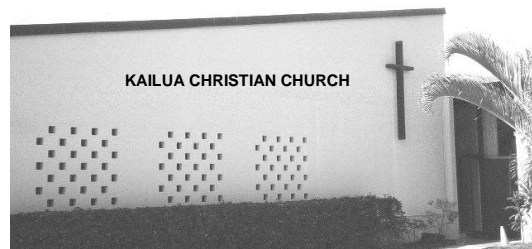

We studied, we ate, we marched, we lit candles and extinguished them, we hiked, we hunted, we worshipped and understood better the events leading up to the resurrection of Jesus as we actively participated in prayer and readings – we created a blooming cross from one that reflected doom. Praise God for the wonder of Jesus' life! Praise God for all of you!



I am wondering if any of you have ever considered how all of these events come together. Many activities are the brainchild of our diligent pastor, while others come from the various boards and committees or from individual church members. Some are traditional and occur in the same way from year to year; yet, as in life, change is inevitable. Some of you wondered why there were no Saturday events – egg coloring and the joy of gathering to prepare for Easter Sunday worship. Looking at all that we do during the season, Council decided this year, to focus in on the events that have the greatest amount of support (in terms of manpower) and which were well attended by the largest number of congregants. This is not to say, that in future years, as the profile of KCC changes, that Easter Saturday will return.

When I was not on the Church Council, I believe I took for granted that worship, church activities and the administrative requirements to support the Church just happen. (Kind of like when my children thought that the money coming out of the bank machine was free.) Having served in various capacities as a Council, board and committee member, I am keenly aware of the commitment made by those who serve you and the Church.

Collectively and cooperatively, your officers, church employees and Pastor meet regularly to insure the coordination of events and activities. Each board and committee generally meets once a month. Pastor Tim meets weekly with the church employees. The Trustees meet every Sunday; and once every month, the Council (comprised of the Board and Committee chairpersons and the Pastor) meet to insure the coordination of events. We welcome each and every suggestion and will give careful consideration to proposed projects. We engage in thoughtful and prayerful discussion about the impact of each project on the church members, the church's resources and physical plant. We try to prepare a church calendar of events, which we hope fill you with the spirit of connection with God and with one another.

Like those pots of soup, we are like the ingredients – different, but when combined -- ahhhh – the delight of worshipping and being a part of Kailua Christian Church!

The event runs from 8:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and includes a plenary session detailing what the association looks like, breakout groups to discuss key areas of concern addressed by past visioning discussions, joint worship and a short business meeting. Youth Buzz:

Thank-you to all the youth and adults who were able to go on the Easter Hike and come to hide eggs and lead the children for our annual Easter Egg Hunt. They hid over three hundred eggs in the playground, nursery, King's Company and Youth rooms and we had only around 25 children finding them. A huge "Mahalo" to Debbie Glenn who stuffed and prepared all the eggs herself.

The youth recycled and the Laus will be redeeming the recyclables at the end of April. We have youth families who have volunteered to redeem the recyclables every other month.

The Youth Group is studying a new series of videos by John Ortberg entitled: "ME, the me I want to be . . . becoming God's best version of you" (Teen Edition). There are 5 sessions: 1) Discovering the Spirit; 2) Renewing My Mind; 3) Redeeming My Time; 4) Deepening My Relationships and 5) Transforming My Experience.

My hope is for each youth to gain a deeper understanding and self-actualization of his/her faith condition.

I would like to ask our general congregation to share with our youth a "life skill" or hobby. I will be holding a series of "self-development seminars" in the Summer months of June, July and August. Our gifts to OCWM multiply the power of each local church to change lives and transform the world. Each month we will highlight just one of the ways OCWM transforms lives. This month's feature: Church Building and Loan Fund

The Church Building & Loan Fund (CB&LF) assists new and renewing congregations with the purchase or construction of their first building. It assists with technical and planning assistance, loans for site purchases, construction, and existing building purchases. In September 2011, Executive Director Rosario Ibarra visited Hawai'i to conduct a workshop for churches eligible for this loan. Fourteen churches attended, including the Chuukese Congregational Church of Christ, and learned about opportunities for ministry in what may be their first church building.

TRUSTEES NEW

As part of KCC’s “Come Share The Lord” initiative, Council/Trustees approved the addition of a “stained glass” window application to the two glass panels at the rear sides of the sanctuary. Also, Chris Nakamatsu will be forming a team to brighten up the exterior and side entrances of the sanctuary by painting the doors and trim a more inviting lighter shade, please see Chris if you can add your time/talents to this effort.

We are also looking into moving the mailbox closer to the driveway entrance and possibly veneer the support post with moss rock. Estimates are being sought. In the same area, we are looking into moving the sign in front of the church, moving it forward and perpendicular to the street so that it would be more easily viewable to passing motorist. Sign laws and regulations need to be explored before this can be done. A major problem would be sight lines for cars exiting the property. All of these proposed projects were derived from a recent Worship Committee meeting. The Trustees are also reviewing our church van. For the little use we make of it, the expenses to keep it are high, the major cost being insurance. We will update you at a future date.

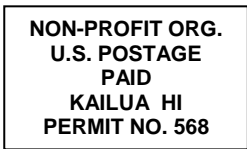
